**Scope of Work:** The Director of Programs oversees the coordination and administration of all of the educational programs at Olivewood Gardens and Learning Center. Programs include our children's nutrition education program, Cooking for Salud® parent education series, volunteer and internship programs, community and family programs, adult farm-to-table cooking classes, school wellness support, and Kitchenistas® Community Engagement program. As an organization rooted in community, this role requires active participation in anti-racist work, and a commitment to equity and inclusion.

### **ESSENTIAL DUTIES**

## PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT 20%

- Develop educational programs for children and adults with the primary goal of changing eating behaviors
- Create data-driven, research-based curriculum through coordination with community partnerships
- Review and revise children's program curriculum, including correlation with Common Core State Standards, Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS), and CA Health Standards
- Assess and design programs for school wellness support, including educator training academies on school garden implementation and garden-based nutrition education strategies
- Collaborate with Development Team on new program development, measuring program outcomes, grant writing, and prospect cultivation
- Work to build effective wellness practices into local schools and school districts through policies and systems
- Modify curriculum for program replication purposes as needed (funding dependent)
- Work with Executive Director to manage program budget
- Support and create connections between garden production and nutrition education



### PROGRAM AND TEAM MANAGEMENT 25%

- Lead all program staff members in orientation and appropriate professional development in accordance with organizational standards and practices
- Monitor program activities on a regular basis and evaluate program effectiveness based on evaluation framework
- Train and mentor Kitchenistas to facilitate nutrition education curriculum for Community Engagement program
- Guide Nutrition and Garden Educators on best practices for delivering instruction for children, adults, and families in an interactive, teaching kitchen and garden
- Support Schools Coordinator on children's program curriculum, as well as partnership development with local schools and districts
- Oversee the collection and maintenance of reporting and evaluation procedures for internship and volunteer program
- Develop and support annual performance plan for staff tied to strategic plan
- Support volunteer coordinator in developing and supporting nearly 400 volunteers annually
- Ensure quality control and food safety protocols

### **PROGRAM EVALUATION 25%**

- Develop and critique evaluation protocol for programs to maximize impact
- Review and modify theory of change, goals and indicators of program activities
- Analyze evaluation data and make necessary program adjustments or pilot programs
- Prepare grant reports and documentation for program funders
- Prepare and present program impact reports for the Executive Director, Board of Directors, and prospects

### STAFF, VOLUNTEER, AND INTERN MANAGEMENT 25%

- Train, mentor, and collaborate with program staff, interns, and volunteers
- Identify, gather, and communicate strategic feedback to Schools Coordinator, Coordinator of Volunteers and Outreach, Environmental Education Specialist, Cooking for Salud Coordinator, and Nutrition Educators to maximize program impact
- Ensure an engaging and rewarding experience for volunteers and interns
- Support high school, college, and RDN intern progress and project development
- Be a role model of respect, curiosity, learning, and encourage staff, volunteer, intern interests/talents

### COMMUNICATION AND OUTREACH 5%

- Participate in Olivewood staff meetings
- Manage and plan programming calendar
- Collaborate with San Diego County school districts, wellness committees, Community Health Improvement partners, San Diego County School Garden Collaborative, and other partners
