School-Based Outdoor Education Internship

Internship Description

Olivewood's School-Based Outdoor Education Internship provides the chance to gain hands-on teaching experience in an urban garden setting. The intern will help to implement science, garden, and nutrition lessons for our school garden education program in National School District elementary schools. As an organization rooted in community, this role requires active participation in anti-racist work and a commitment to diversity and inclusion. Internships are unpaid, but class credit is available.

Commitment

The School-Based Outdoor Education Intern will commit to approximately 10 to 12 hours per week for a total of 120 hours. Our school-based lessons occur on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday during school hours.

Internship Goals

- Gain first-hand teaching experience with an environmental and nutrition education program
- Learn about experiential education techniques in a non-traditional classroom setting
- Collaborate with the Olivewood team in projects that support school-based lessons
- Understand local health concerns and education challenges

Duties

- Co-facilitate science, garden, or nutrition lessons for youth while adhering to lesson objectives, incorporating garden features, monitoring student behavior, and working within specific time constraints
- Provide feedback on lesson successes and suggestions for improvement

Qualifications

We are seeking individuals with an interest in working with youth, attention to detail, and an appreciation for the garden, science, and nutrition lessons taught in the garden. The ideal candidate...

- Has experience working with children
- Is a good public speaker with strong interpersonal skills
- Has a demonstrated interest in science or nature
- Is a current college student or recent college graduate
- Is eager to make cross-cultural connections
- Is eager to learn and have fun!

Applicants studying education, child and family development, environmental science, sustainability, biology, or ecology are preferred. Spanish language proficiency is ideal, but not required.
